## Juan Manuel Saharrea, "The Experimentalist Approach in Dewey's Theory of Democratic Education"

According to Gert Biesta, Dewey does not offer a theory of democratic education but a general approach to socialization. This paper questions his conclusion through a two-fold strategy. On the one hand, it points out that Biesta's analysis assumes two dichotomies that do not fit Dewey's philosophy: an empirical vs normative theory and a theory of socialization vs schooling. On the other hand, even when Biesta's criticism of *Democracy and Education* is appealing, it does not do justice to 1) other



educational texts or 2) other areas of Dewey philosophy. Biesta's interpretation represents a way of reading Dewey's educational theory without taking into consideration seriously the larger project in which Dewey's educational reflections are presented.

Dr. Juan Manuel Saharrea is Professor at the Catholic University of Cordoba and the National University of San Luis. He is currently a Fulbright Scholar at Texas A&M University.
